Economic Growth 2020-2024:

- **\$1,045,010,000 (yes 1 BILLION) in capital improvements** either ongoing or planned for Commercial, Manufacturing and Industrial creation of **779 High Quality Jobs and 218 PTE**. *Does not include a pending \$1.7 Billion Rail Park project.*
- **\$87,506,000 million** for housing (single family and apartments) to name just two; \$13,500,000 invested for the Wilson Building Apartments, and Cottage Bluff investment of \$7,800,000 to be completed by December 2023.
- As we discussed, we like to say we are **“right sizing”** specifically with over 9000 folks that commute each day to work in Clinton, plenty of folks to inspire with updated housing!
- Assess value increases actually leads to a lowering of property taxes...

Finance

- Strong financial position
- A3 (AAA) triple A credit rating
- The City levy was below the 15-year average in both FY24 and FY25.
- Solid Waste and Sewer rates have stayed the same since 2017.
- 10 years of successful audits with transparent budgeting practices.
- A Capital Improvement Plan that keeps our city's priorities funded.

Clerk's Office

- City continues to return properties to the tax rolls. **\$324,000 by property sales.**
- **Over 100 subscribers and counting.** The City's iCompass (CivicWeb) site has all meeting agendas, minutes and videos as well as press releases. Citizens can sign up for free to receive notifications for any items that get posted to the site.
- Nearly **100 records** requests received in 2024 alone.
- **20 bid** requests entered into ION Wave by the Clerk's office, in partnership with some other departments.
- Krista continues to knock social media out of the park.
 - For 2024, social media stats:
 - Facebook – 6,327 followers, 1,008 new followers in 2024. *Marshall's Opening #1*
 - Instagram – 981 followers, 136 new followers in 2024. *USA Concert Post #2*
 - X – 338 followers, 25 new followers in 2024.
- Switched to online applications for board, commission and committee volunteers. Nearly **40 applications** submitted online thus far.
- Put the Pre-Application for the EPA Community Change Grant on the City website. Over **100 pre-applications** were submitted through the City website.
- City Clerk licenses are over **160 licenses for 2024** (food trucks, tree trimmers, etc.), over **70 liquor licensees** and over **30 tobacco, nicotine, vape licenses.**
- New CGI videos completed.

Community Development

- **2018 International Property Maintenance Code** in 2020
- The city has demolished over **155 nuisance properties**, with property owners taking responsibility for **50 additional demolitions** at their own cost.
- In 2024, **39 properties** were given notice under IPMC and **19 abated** the issues with the **20 working** on violation or having an action plan.
- Owners this year have conduct demoliton on **15 houses and 8 garages**.
- The city's **Roof Program** completed 16 roofs in the past two years
